Each leaflet includes a "How to Participate" section that answers frequently asked questions like who can receive holy Communion; what to do for those can't or don't want to kneel; when it's okay to take photos; how to handle children during the ceremony; and more.

This book challenges everyone who prepares the liturgy of Infant Baptism to understand it is the action of the community that begets new believers. The author applies the standards of full, conscious and active participation of the assembly; the word proclaimed and preached; the integration of music and ritual; and the abundant use of symbols, gestures and movements to the *Rite of Baptism of Children*.

This 16 page popular guide deals with the practical questions that concern parents and sets the scene for personal parish instruction. The full-color, magazine-style format is easy-to-use and appeals to today's parents. It covers such topics as: the baptism service, common questions people ask, practical suggestions on family life, and more.

This book grows as a child grows. From birth through age six and all the growing days in between, *Child of God* provides the perfect place to gather thoughts, prayers and memories. It also makes a wonderful tool for baptismal preparation program directors and parents as it follows along the beginning years of raising a child in faith. Most pages open with a short sentence or two from scripture or traditional Christian prayers, accented with bits of art. Capture baby handprints and footprints, photos, newspaper clippings, a lock of hair, a lost tooth. Record poignant stories, special drawings, dates of sacraments received and pieces of family history.

Godparents and grandparents will also find places to contribute. After the pages are filled, put this book away and later present it to a grown child as a special gift.

 Ramshaw, Elaine. <u>The Godparent Book</u>. Chicago, IL: Liturgy Training Publications, 1993.

This book offers an abundance of ideas for things that godparents and godchildren can do from before Baptism through adulthood. Included are suggestions for building the relationship by sharing the memories, thoughts, values, prayers, and seasons of Christian life.

• Turner, Paul. <u>Your Child's Baptism</u>. Chicago, IL: Liturgy Training Publications, 2009.

What should parents know as they prepare to have their child baptized? This book provides parents with answers to their most frequently asked questions and addresses their most frequently voiced concerns. Topics include the age of the child, parental consent, church attendance habits, qualifications for eligibility to serve as a godparent, the number of godparents, non-Catholic godparents and proxies, and more. The Rite of Baptism is also outlined. Keep copies of this well-priced book on hand to give to new or expecting parents and those inquiring about Baptism. Great for baptismal preparation programs.
