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MEDITATION ON THE GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT-PROCESSION OF CANDLES

Reader #1

As Confirmed Christians, the Gifts of the Holy Spirit are actively present in us. They are the gifts that keep on giving. We need only call upon the Gift of the Spirit to realize its influence. Let us focus for a moment on each of these gifts. To symbolize the presence of the Spirit in our lives, we will light and focus on the candle representing that gift as we meditate on the meaning of the gift.

Reader #2

The first lighted candle represents the gift of Wisdom. The gift of Wisdom helps us sees things through God's eyes. A wise person doesn't look at things from just one point of view but sees the whole picture. Wisdom helps us judge all the events in our lives according to our belief in God.

Reader #1

The second candle represents the Gift of Understanding. This gift enables us to gain deeper insights into what we believe by faith. The gift of Understanding leads us beyond just knowing the beliefs of the Church. It is "heart-knowledge." To understand is to see from another person's heart—to feel and to know the feelings of another's heart.

Reader #2

The third candle represents the Gift of Counsel or Right Judgment. Right Judgment means making good decisions. In order to make good decisions, one needs to do the necessary background work, to look at the alternatives, and to study the consequences. With the Gift of Counsel or Right Judgment, we need not make hard decisions by ourselves. We can turn to the Catholic Community for help and guidance when we need to see the right thing to do among the many choices we have to make every day.

Reader #1

The fourth candle represents the Gift of Courage. This gift helps us to be strong in our beliefs as Christians, to live firmly by faith instead of by fear. The gift of Courage is the gift that enables a person to live up to the decisions he or she has made, no matter what obstacles emerge. Courage means following one's own convictions no matter what the cost may be.

Reader #2

The fifth candle represents the Gift of Knowledge. This gift broadens the minds and hearts of Christians so that when they come together they can learn and share with one another. It is the gift of thinking clearly and understanding the world as it is.

Reader #1

The sixth candle represents the Gift of Reverence. The Gift of Reverence teaches a person to treasure life and all that sustains it. The gift of Reverence helps us to hold reality as loving parents would hold their children—with tenderness and great care. It encourages us to praise God freely and to respect all people.

Reader #2

The last candle represents the Gift of Wonder and Awe in God's Presence. It is the gift which allows us to recognize, with a profound sense of amazement, that we are always in God's presence. This gift allows a person to experience all of life as a great gift given by God. It helps us respect the goodness and majesty of God.

Reader #1

These gifts of the Holy Spirit are not granted just for the happiness of the person who receives them. They are given for

the good of your entire parish, for the good of the whole

Church, and for the good of the entire world. The gifts Holy Spirit are given to build up the Body of Christ and make it holy. The Body of Christ is made holy because gifts strengthen Christians to bear witness to Christ. enable the People of God to live as Jesus lived. The gifts

members and total participants in Christian Life.
